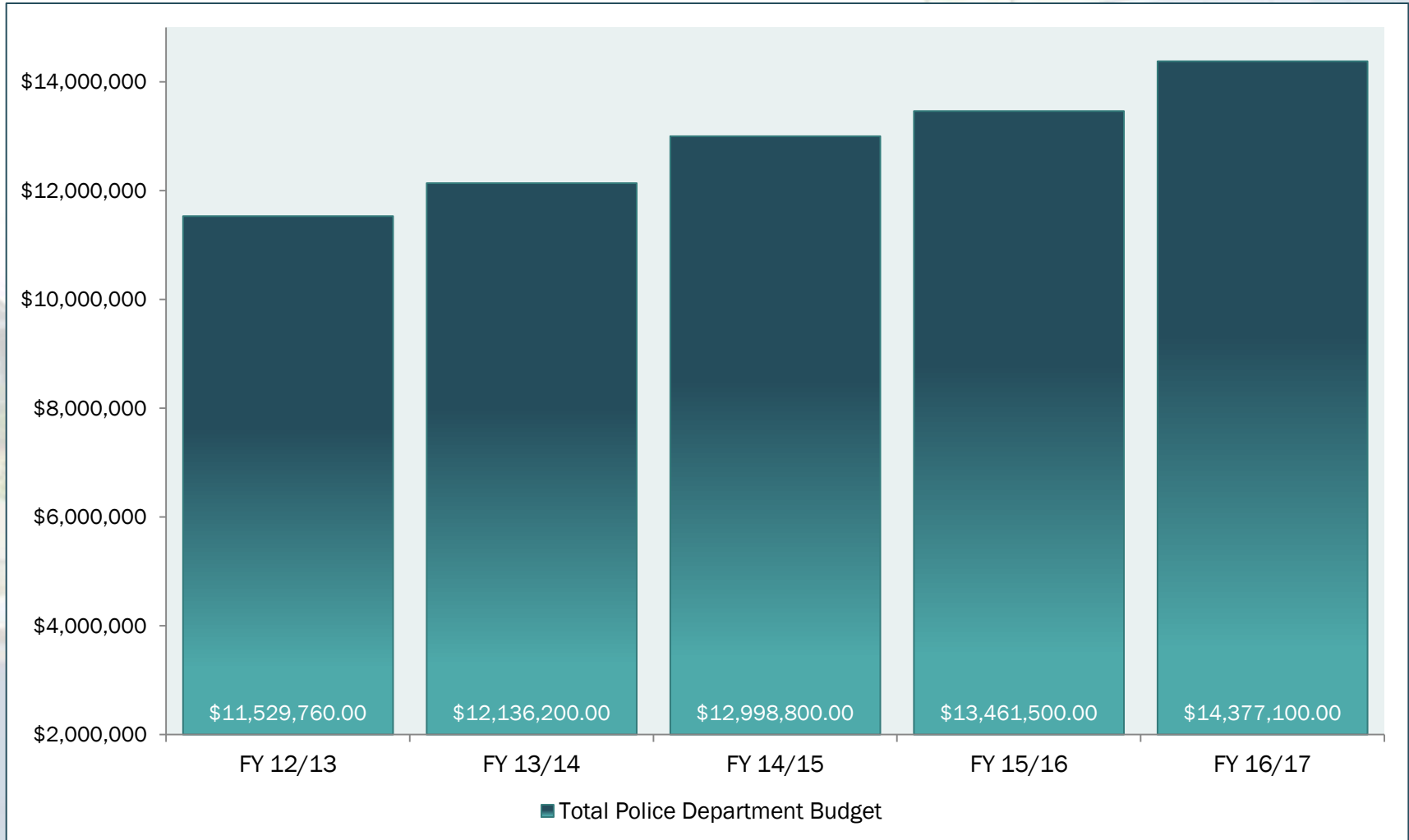

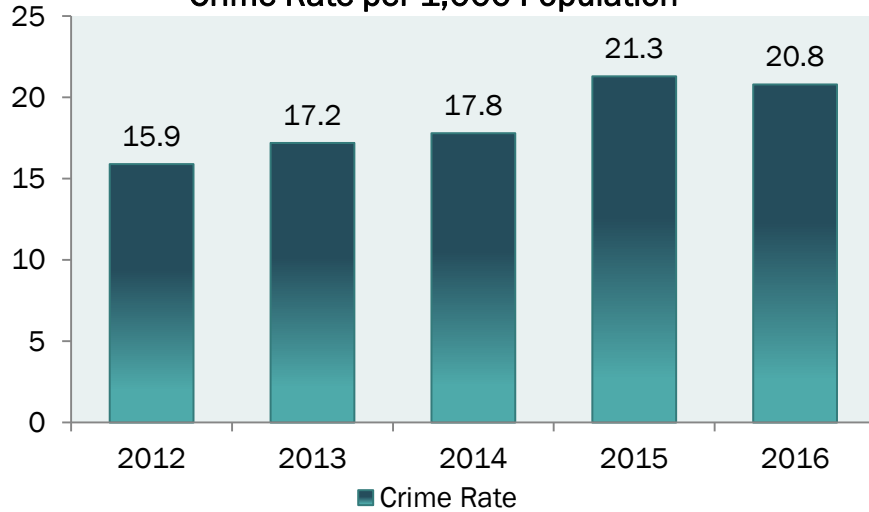




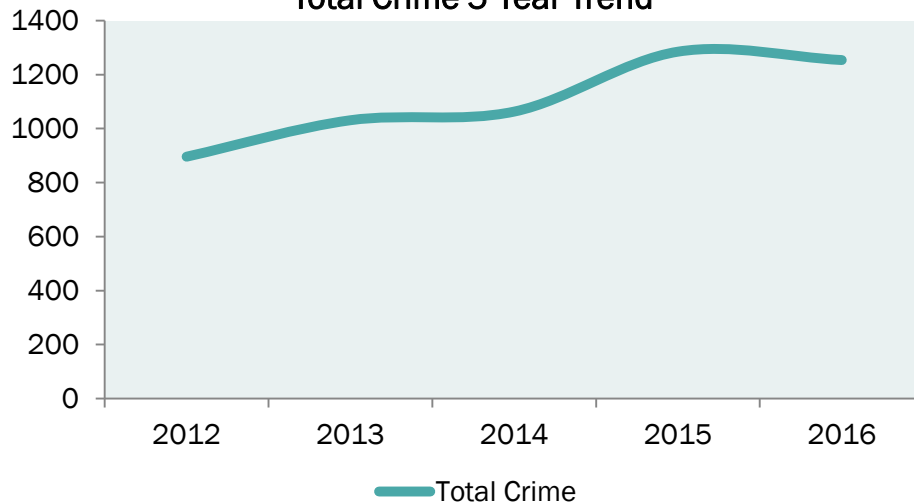

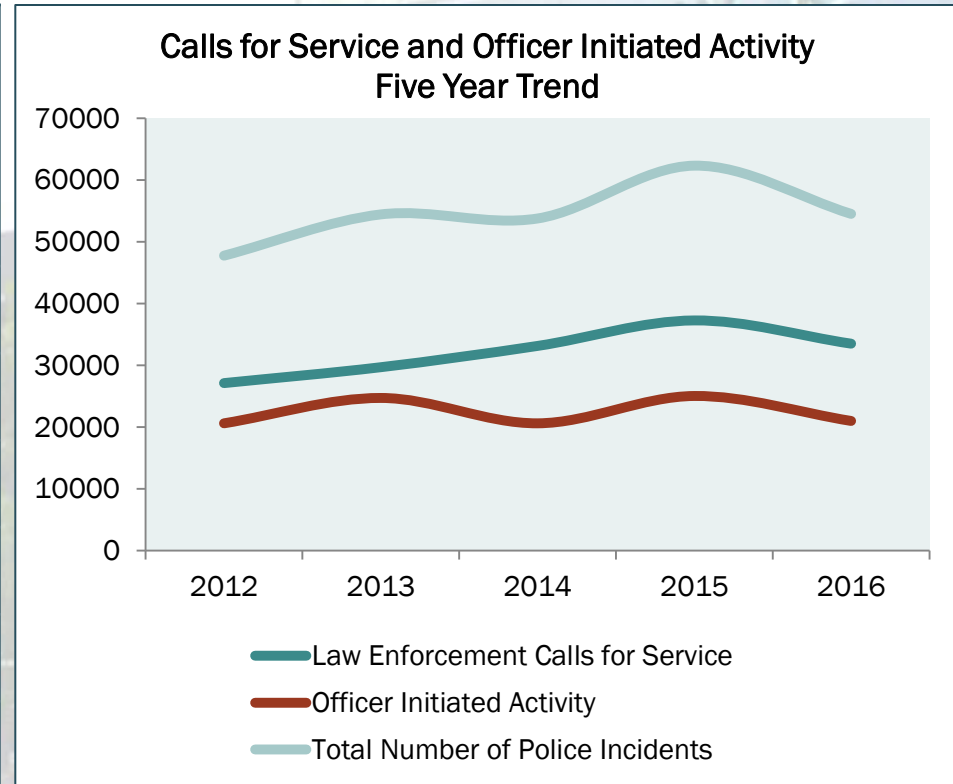
Theft from vehicle (vehicle burglary) accounted for 54% of all larceny for the year. Shoplifting accounted for another 25% of the larceny total.

Law enforcement calls for service decreased 11%, officer initiated activity decreased 19% and total police incidents decreased 14%.

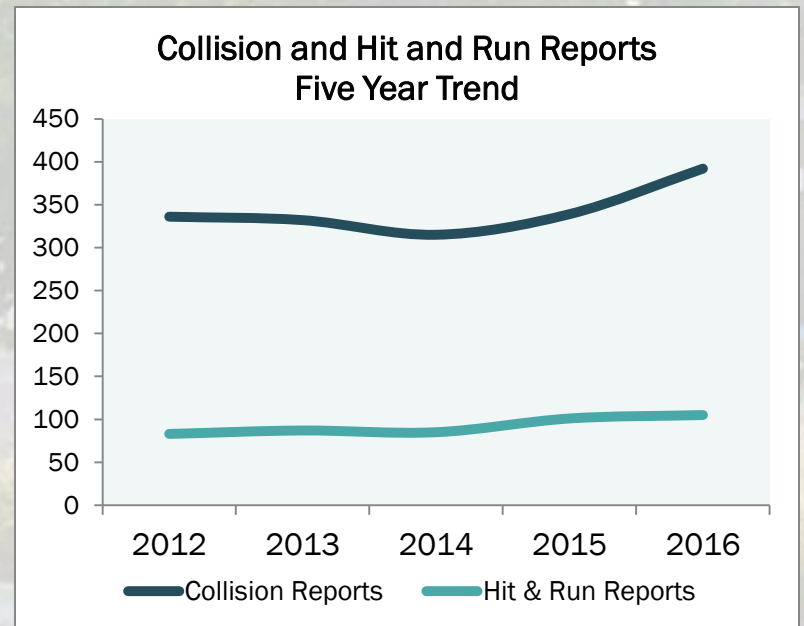
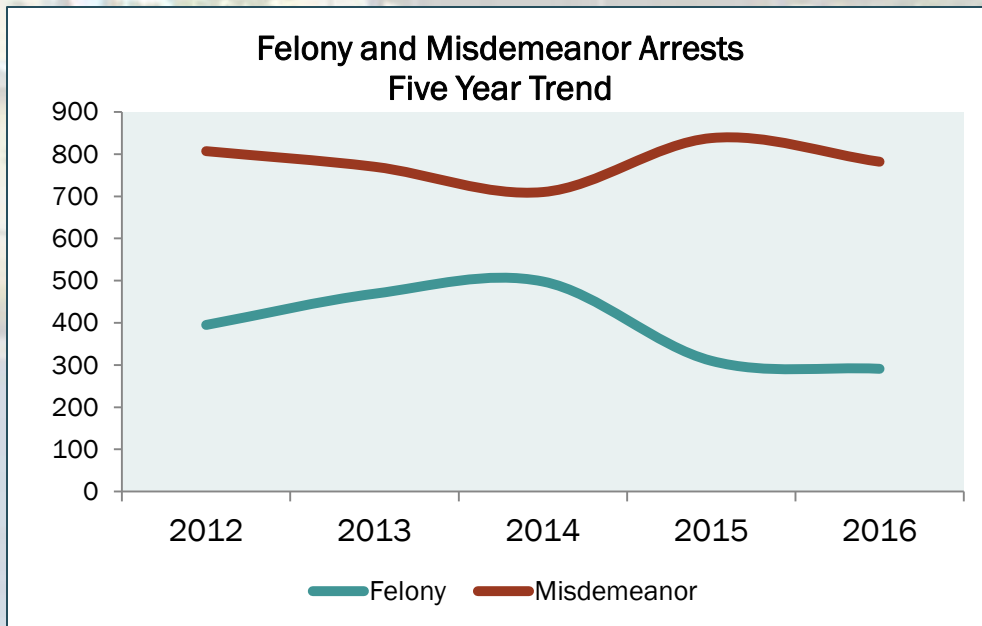

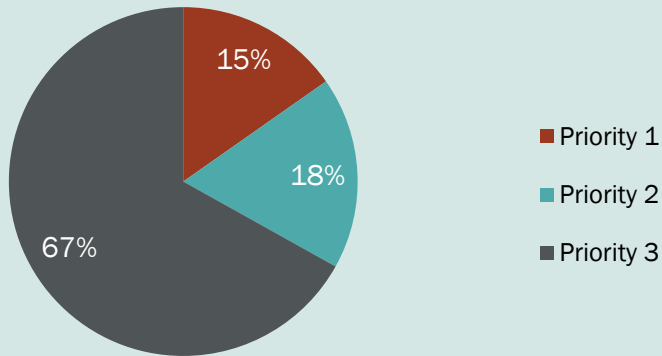
Overall, injury and non-injury collisions increased by 16%. Hit and run collisions increased by 4%.



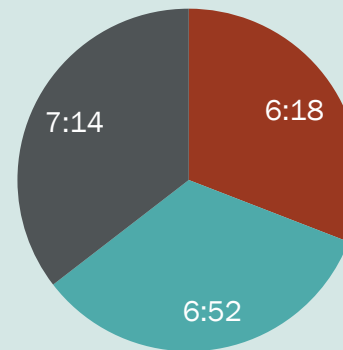

### Call by Priority Type

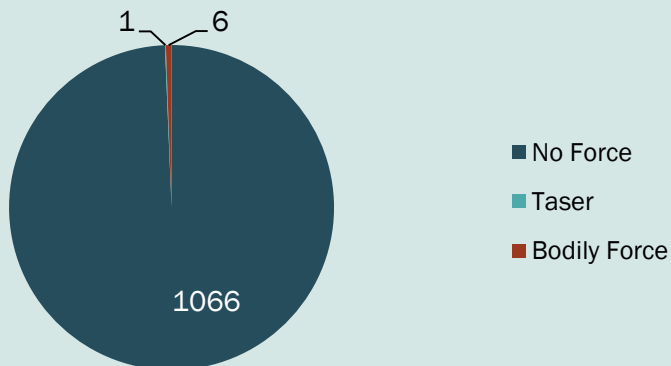


### Response Time

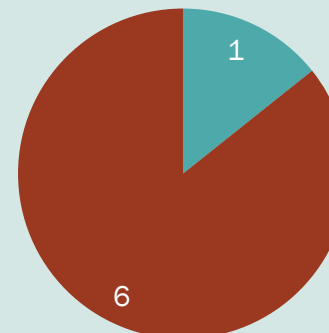


Priority 1 – Emergency situations requiring immediate police response

Officers used a Response to Resistance when making an arrest only 7 times during 2016, which is less than .65% of the total 1073 arrests made. Of the times Response to Resistance was used, a Taser was used .09%, bodily force .56%, K9 0%, pepper spray 0%, baton 0%, and deadly force/firearm 0%.

### PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS

The Professional Standards Unit (PSU) is responsible for protecting the integrity and reputation of the police department. The PSU's duties range from managing the agency's accreditation process, to overseeing the complaint and commendation process of police personnel.

The Rocklin Police Department has been a nationally accredited agency for the past seven years.

Accreditation is awarded by the Commission on Accreditation of Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). Rocklin PD participates in this voluntary process to pursue excellence, and to ensure the highest law enforcement standards are maintained.

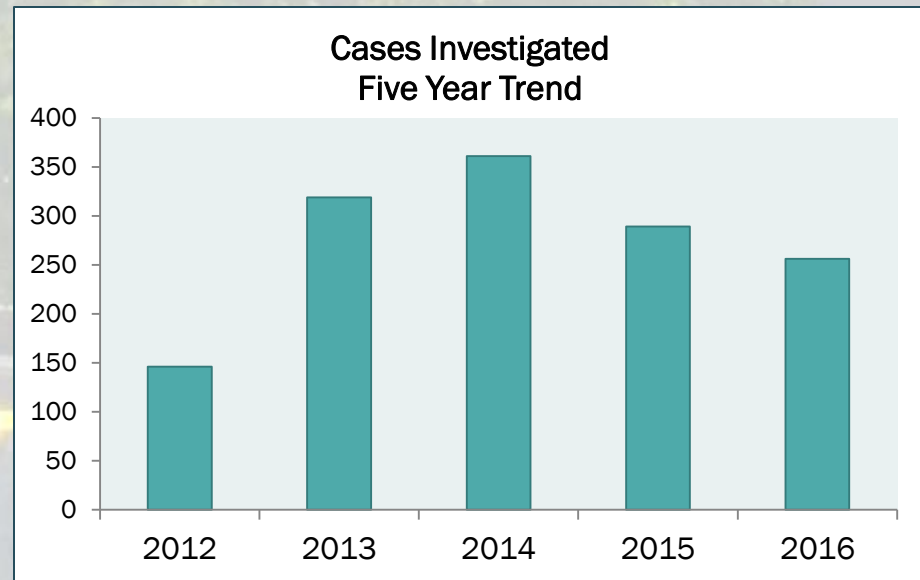
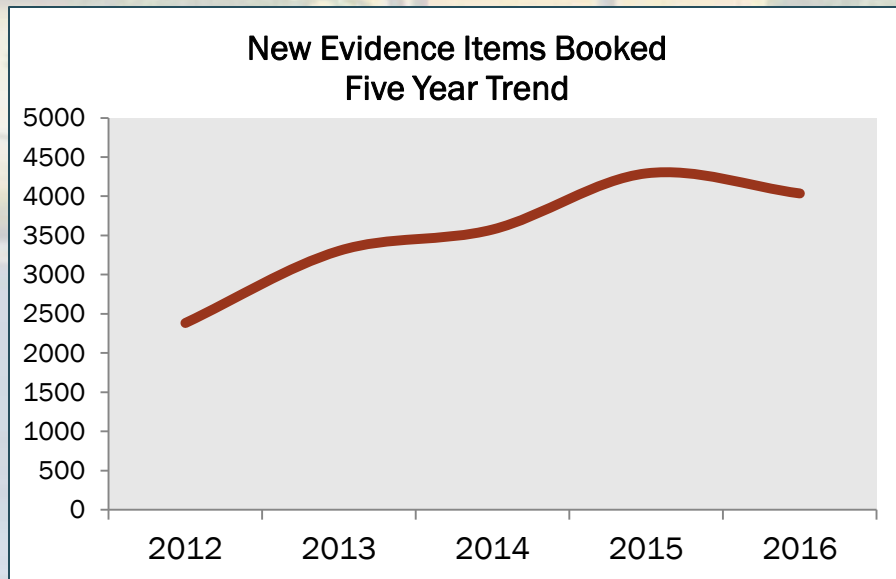
There are 509 local law enforcement agencies in California. Rocklin is one of only 17 accredited agencies in California and among only 5% in the nation.
