Rocklin Police Department Holding DUI Checkpoint March 20, 2026

Rocklin, Calif. – On 3/20/26, the Rocklin Police Department will conduct a driving under the influence (DUI) Checkpoint from 6:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m. at an undisclosed location.

DUI checkpoint locations are determined based on data showing incidents of impaired driving-related crashes. The primary purpose of DUI checkpoints is to promote public safety by taking suspected impaired drivers off the road.

“Impaired drivers unreasonably place other drivers, pedestrians and bicyclists at risk of unneeded injury or death,” Lieutenant Costa said. “Education and enforcement of DUI laws, with emphasis on education, is key to combating DUI violations and promoting safer roadways for our citizens.”

The Rocklin Police Department reminds the public that impaired driving is not just from alcohol. Some prescription medications and over-the-counter drugs may also interfere with driving. While medicinal and recreational marijuana are legal, driving under the influence of marijuana is illegal.

Drivers charged with a first-time DUI face an average of \$13,500 in fines and penalties, as well as a suspended license.
