	7	there are some inconsistencies and some things that I
*	8	have some problems with, but I will submit those in

	10	But on the whole, I appreciate everybody coming.
	11	But as I said, I'm usually the bad guy here. I want to
	12	keep my reputation up.
	13	VICE MAYOR YORDE: I have a couple comments.
	14	I'll try not to get too philosophical on some of them.
	15	I thought the lady's comment about the deer on
74 1	16	the spikes was an important comment. I also have a
74-1	17	concern about that EIR issue, because I've seen a deer
	18	try to get through between those iron fences and
	19	actually ram against that so many times the animal
	20	actually bent the fence. She never did get through. I
	21	think that's something that has to get addressed in the
	22	EIR.
74-2	23	From a flood perspective, I'd like to see what
	24	the total runoff is on a no-project thing versus a
	25	developed-project thing for the hundred-year flood event
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in the valley, because I think that's important. From a philosophical thing, years ago, the county had a program that I was a very active supporter, 3 Placer Legacy, which was a program to buy open space in the county. The Placer Legacy program got voted in 74-2 favor by a large majority, but the funding side of it, Cont when people were asked in the county, "Do you want to fund it?" it got shut down. So people like to -- want 8 to keep everything open space, but we don't want to pay 9 for that. That's a philosophical point. 10 Anyway, with that, I guess -- if anybody has any 11 more comments? If not, I'm going to close the public 12 hearing. And I thank everybody for coming. Thanks for 13 your input. We've gotten some good ideas from it. 14 Thank you.
