


PCWA Dry Year Efforts June 22, 2021

- Focusing on efficient water use both inside and outside



What we're asking of our community

- 1. Stress your lawn and save your trees
- 2. Check soil moisture before turning on sprinklers
- 3. Replace older sprinklers with more efficient nozzles
- 4. Upgrade to WaterSense-labeled weather-based sprinkler timer
- 5. Water plants early in the morning to reduce evaporation
- 6. Inside your home, check and fix leaks
- 7. Mulch 2-3"
- 8. Adjust sprinklers to prevent overspray



Tips for Tree Care During Drought

cleaner air and cooler temperatures,
replenishes groundwater, enhances
public health, and creates vibrant,
livable neighborhoods.

As the California climate becomes hotter and drier, our urban forest will be even more valuable. Saving our existing tree canopy and planting new trees is wise, not wasteful.




