

Trash, Junk, and Debris

Trash, junk, and debris not only causes blight within a neighborhood, but it can

also harbor rodents, vermin and mosquitoes. For Rocklin's Clean-Up information on Day Program, contact the City of Rocklin's Public Services Department at 916.625.5500. For waste disposal and recycling programs, contact the Western Placer Waste Management Authority at 916.645.5230, and for garbage dumpster rentals, Auburn Placer contact the Recology 530.885.3735. In addition, garbage dumpsters may require an encroachment permit. To determine if an encroachment permit is required, please contact the City of Rocklin's Public Services Department at 916.625.5500.



Vegetation-Overgrown Dead

Vegetation should be cut down periodically to prevent overgrowth and trees should be maintained properly. Overgrown vegetation visible from a public street may obstruct drivers' views, impede pedestrians on sidewalks, or harbor rats or vermin. In addition, dead, decayed, or diseased trees, weeds, or other vegetation is unsightly and may be dangerous to public safety. If you have questions, please contact Code Compliance at 916.625.5498.



RV, Trailer, Boat, Camper Storage & Parking

RVs, trailers, boats and campers must be stored in a garage, a commercial storage facility, or on a solid surface (on private residential property, outside of the front and street side yard setbacks). For information on setback locations for your property, please contact the Planning Division at 916.625.5160.

Provided that the RV, trailer, boat, or camper is not parked for more than 9 days in any 30 day period, they may be parked in the driveway or any other solid surface in the front or street side yard setbacks for up to 48 hours for the purposes of loading, unloading, cleaning, and general maintenance or they can be parked on public streets in residential areas for up to 72 consecutive hours.



Vehicles—Inoperable

Accumulation and storage of abandoned, wrecked, dismantled, or inoperable

vehicles or vehicle parts can reduce property values, attract children into a potentially hazardous situation, harbor rodents and insects, and promote crime. In residential neighborhoods, vehicles of this nature and vehicle parts are to be stored within a completely enclosed building in a lawful manner or where it is otherwise not visible from the street or other public or private property. PRESERVING ROCKLIN: A HOMEOWNER'S GUIDE TO PROPERTY MAINTENANCE



Homeowners and property owners are responsible for maintaining safe, clean, and attractive properties. This brochure outlines major City of Rocklin codes and policies relating to property maintenance.

Fencing on private property needs to be maintained. Often times fences are shared by two property owners who will work

together to maintain or replace fences.

To determine allowable fencing heights and locations, please contact the Planning Division at 916.625.5160.



Garage and Yard Sales

A permit from the City is not required to have a garage/yard sale. Signs for the garage/yard sale may not be placed in the public property such as on utility poles, in street medians, or on public sidewalks, but one sign may be on your property advertising the sale up to a maximum area of 3 square feet. Garbage Service

Garbage service in Rocklin is mandatory. Recology Auburn Placer

Disposal may impose a lien on the property if the account is delinquent. If you have questions, please contact Recology Auburn Placer at 530.885.3735.



Home Based Businesses

Businesses operated out of a home require a Home Business Permit and

a Business License from the City of Rocklin's Community Development at 916.625.5100 for information on licensing and permitting requirements.



Construction noise generating activities may occur Monday through Friday

from 7AM-7PM and from 8AM-7PM on Saturdays and Sundays.

Construction noise outside of these hours or noise that disturbs the peace can be reported to the Police Department at 916.625.5400.



Oak Trees

The City has an Oak Tree Preservation Ordinance. Removing oak trees requires a

permit from the City. Oak trees are a valuable resource and are to be preserved. Before cutting down any oak tree, check with the City to see if a permit is required for the removal. Contact the Planning Division at 916.625.5160 for Oak Tree Removal Permit fees and requirements.



Open Space and Wetlands

There are many undeveloped lots within the City of Rocklin that have been set aside to be

preserved as open space. Planting, dumping, storing materials or equipment, or otherwise disturbing these open space parcels is prohibited. To report open space that is not being properly maintained, or for related issues, contact Public Services at 916.625.5500.



Outdoor Burning

Outdoor brush burning is <u>no longer allowed</u> within the city limits of Rocklin. A free

residential chipping program is available in Western Placer County by calling Cal Fire Auburn Headquarters at 530.889.0111.

Wood burning BBQs and fire pits are allowed provided that they do not emit excessive smoke and that treated lumber, leaves, and/or tree trimmings are not being used for fuel.



Pet Licenses and Waste

For all dogs over the age of four months, a City of Rocklin dog license is required.

Contact the Police Department at 916.625.5400 for licensing requirements and fees.

It is also important to pick up pet waste and dispose of it properly, as it contains disease-carrying bacteria that can make people sick, wash into our storm drains, and pollute our waterways.



Portable Play Equipment

Portable play equipment such as basketball hoops and skateboard ramps are not allowed

in public streets or sidewalks when they would block normal typical pedestrian or vehicle paths of travel. If you have questions, please contact Code Compliance at 916.625.5498.



Inspections

The City, on a request basis, inspects residential properties to identify health

and safety hazards, and other building code violations that should be corrected. A more comprehensive voluntary building code inspection is performed by the Building Division for an inspection fee that covers the cost of this service. The fee may be waived for dwellings occupied by disabled, very low or extremely low income households. Owners of these units would be offered an opportunity to participate in the City's Home Repair Program. Call 916.625.5120 for more information.



Sidewalks

Sidewalks provide a safe place for pedestrians to travel along roadways.

Vehicles, power cords, and vegetation should not encroach onto or over sidewalks. If you have questions, contact Code Compliance at 916.625.5135.



Storm Drains and Creeks

The storm drain at the curbside leads directly to our natural water system,

including local creeks, ponds, and streams. When pollutants like detergents, pesticides, fertilizers, pet waste, sediment, grease, dirt, motor oil or paint are washed or dumped into the storm drains, it contaminates our waterways. If you have questions, contact Public Services at 916.625.5500.



Swimming Pools

Pool water can harm local creeks, ponds, and streams if disposed of in the storm

drains. Prior to draining a pool, contact Public Services at 916.625.5500 for information on proper disposal methods. Stagnant or abandoned swimming pools can be a breeding ground for mosquitoes. The Placer Mosquito & Vector Control District (PMVCD) will assist pool owners by performing inspections and treating for mosquitoes, as needed. To report stagnant pools, standing water, or request an inspection, please contact the PMVCD at 916.435.2140. For children's safety, pools must be surrounded by a fence. For information on fencing requirements, contact Building Dept. at 916.625.5120.
