Thank you for contacting us regarding possible moving the Coker Plaza building at 4561 Pacific Street in Rocklin, California. Delgado & Fonseca, Inc. is a professional home and building moving company that has been in business since 1979. We have moved hundreds of residences and other buildings throughout northern California.

I inspected the Coker Plaza building on July 26th to evaluate the potential for relocating this building. In short, this is a large concrete building attached to a concrete foundation with multiple additions built-on over the years that cannot reasonably be relocated. This is not a type of construction that can be separated from its foundation, disassembled and then reassembled. This concrete building would effectively have to be broken apart if you were to try to relocate it. That is not feasible.

The entire building consists of an original concrete building on a concrete foundation, with several stick-frame additions to it over the years. The entire building is approximately larger than 13,000 square feet. The building measures approximately 146 feet along the front and approximately 100 feet along the west side. The east and rear sides have irregular shapes.

Enclosed are photos of the building from various viewpoints. Of note, photo number 4 shows the details of concrete construction. For example, you will see the evidence of the form boards in the concrete sides and the bolts at the top of the wall.
