ROCKLIN SUMMER CIVIC CAREER PROGRAM APPLICATION

The City of Rocklin has joined with the Rocklin Educational Excellence Foundation (REEF) and the Rocklin Unified School District (RUSD) to offer the Summer Civic Career Program (SCCP). SCCP introduces students to the many local government career opportunities. This program allows students to make important contributions to the City while participating in a challenging and rewarding work experience.

During the two-week program, students will partner with City staff and assist with a variety of programs and projects in various departments. The two-week program is scheduled for **June 16-19 and June 23-26, 2025**, Monday through Thursday, 8:30 AM to 12:30 PM.

Participation requirements:

- Must currently be enrolled at a Rocklin Unified School District High School
- Be at least 16 years of age
- A senior for the 2025/2026 school year
- · Available to attend each day of the program
- Reliable transportation to and from different locations within the City of Rocklin

Throughout the two-week program, students will keep a journal and share entries in group discussions with their fellow students. Participants will be asked for meaningful feedback on their experience in an effort to continuously improve the program. At the conclusion of the two-week program, participants will submit their journal and a short essay (no longer than 500 words) describing what they have learned and how it will benefit their future.

Upon successful completion of the program, REEF will award each student a \$500 scholarship. Student recognition will be held at the Rocklin City Council Meeting on August 26, 2025.

Highlights for the 2025 Rocklin Summer Civic Career Program (SCCP)

Administrative Services, City Clerk, City Attorney, and City Manager's Offices

These offices are responsible for key compliance requirements of local government. Ensuring the city addresses finance and budget needs, liability concerns, legal procedures, public notices, public outreach (including social media), hiring needs, and legal. At the last day of the program, students will also participate in a Mock City Council Meeting and learn about the Brown Act which provides public access to meetings of California local government.

Community Development Department

Community Development is another large department that helps the public with things like permits, building inspections, new development, code enforcement, planning, and housing. Students will get the talk with Building Inspectors, Code Enforcement Officers, and other that that help make Rocklin such a great place to live and to have a business.

Fire Department

Students will work with Fire Department staff at a fire station and in the administration office learning about fire prevention, fire suppression, and firefighting equipment. This may include riding along on fire apparatus, while the firefighters respond to calls for service.

Parks and Recreation Department

Parks and Recreation is responsible for the maintenance of the amazing parks in Rocklin, planning and organizing fun events and services for our community, promoting healthy lifestyles and ensuring there are places that make that happen. Students will get to learn more about how much work and long-range planning goes into having Rocklin's great parks and recreation programs.

Police Department

Students will work with staff in the Police Department, gaining hands-on experience with police officers at the station, dispatchers in the communications center, learn about some of the newest technologies that help law enforcement and the crucial work of support staff in bringing law-breakers to justice.

Public Works Department

Public Works is a wide-ranging department that includes engineering and environmental services, facilities and fleet upkeep, care of city-owned streets and landscape, and traffic signal maintenance. Students will have the opportunity to visit active construction sites and see what happens to their trash after they put in the One Big Bin.

This year's program will provide each participant an opportunity to experience the many facets of local government. One goals of the program is to showcase different aspects of government work students may not be familiar with. Students are expected to engage and be open to learning about work they may not have considered before.
